

How to measure for replacement countertops:

These instructions and photos are kitchen related, but this method can be applied to any countertop in your home -- bathroom vanity, laundry room, desk area, etc.

Step 1: Draw a rough drawing of the countertop. It does not need to be to scale or perfect.

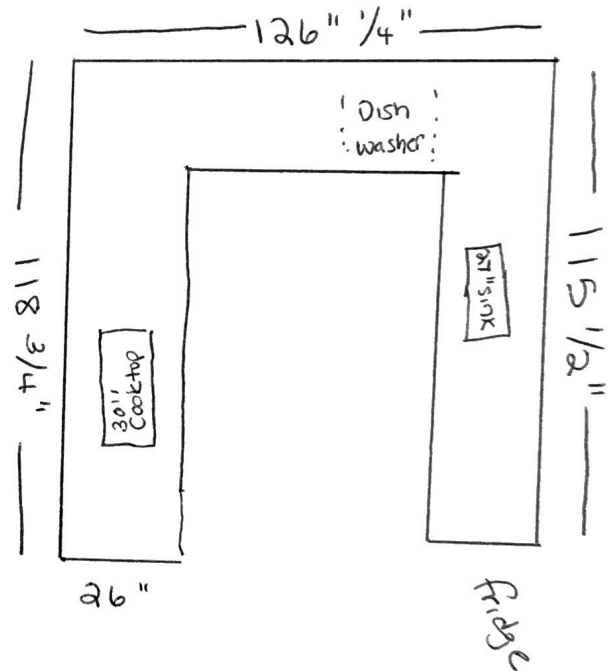
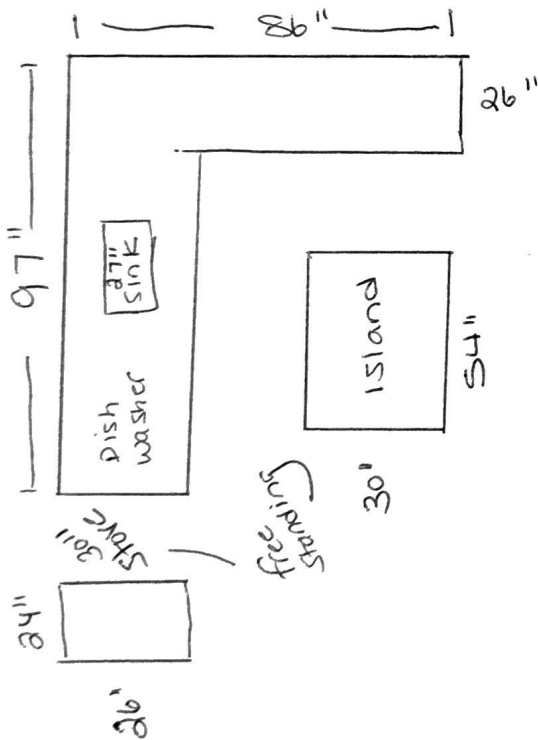
Step 2: Measure the length (left to right) and width (front to back) of each side on your drawing. Round up to the next 1/4" if you are unsure. Ex. 115-5/8" round to 115-3/4".

Step 3: If there is a sink present, draw in the sink and measure the cabinet or sink size.

Step 4: Call out placement of any appliance; Fridge, Freestanding or slide in Range, Dishwasher, cooktop, etc.

Step 5: Note the current thickness and material of your existing top and if you would like removal of this top included in the service.
